The Component of Traditional Thesis Format

1. Preliminary Section

1.1 Cover

1.1.1 Outer Cover This page contains the thesis title, author's name, title of degree and field of study, graduation year. The last line must state that the thesis is the copyright of the Prince of Songkla University. The outer cover is made of hard paper covered with black paper with embossed with gold letters.

1.1.2 The Spine of the thesis contains the thesis title, author's name and graduation year.

1.1.3 Back Cover

1.2 Blank Page.

1.3 Title Page This page contains the details similar to those on the Outer Cover.

1.4 Approval Page. This page contains the thesis title, author's name, Major Advisor, Co-advisor(s), members of Examining Committees, and Dean of the Graduate School.

1.5 Certification The certified content signed by the author and advisor.

1.6 Abstract Page This page contains the thesis title, author's name, major program, academic year. The abstract should include objectives, goals, scope of the research, research methodology and research findings. It must be accurate, complete, precise, concise and clear. It should only report significant findings and statistical data of the research. It must not exceed 1 page in Thai and 1 page in English.

1.7 Acknowledgement Page. Acknowledgements are statements of gratitude to any individual, institution and/or agency that provided assistance or cooperation during the course of the work for the thesis. They should be extended to members of Thesis Advisory Committee, Thesis Defense Committee, financial sponsor, individual who provided suggestions and information as well as those who permitted the use of writings and research equipment. Acknowledgements should be written in plain academic style and avoid using spoken and colloquial language. Individuals should be referred to by the first name-family name with titles, ranks of authority, titles conferred by being priestly rank. It must not exceed 1 page.

- 1.8 Contents.** This page outlines important sections of the thesis in the proper order of page numbers.
 - 1.9 List of Tables** (if any). This page lists the captions and page numbers of all the tables that appear in the thesis.
 - 1.10 List of Figures, List of Illustrations** (if any). This page lists the page number of all figures (figures, maps, charts and graphs) in the thesis.
 - 1.11 List of Abbreviations and Symbols** (if any). This page describes any symbols and abbreviation used in the thesis.
- 2. Text Section**
- 2.1 Social Science and Humanities**
 - 2.1.1 Introduction.** This is the first chapter of the thesis that provides background information and indicates the significance of the problem, research objectives, scope, brief methodology and benefits.
 - 2.1.2 Methodology**
 - 2.1.3 Result**
 - 2.1.4 Conclusion and Suggestion** This section summarizes the whole thesis while indicating limitations of the research (if any) and providing suggestions for further research effort, possible research benefits and applications.
 - 2.2 Science and Technology & Health Sciences**
 - 2.2.1 Introduction.** This is the first chapter of the thesis that provides background information and indicates the significance of the problem, research objectives, scope, brief methodology and benefits.
 - 2.2.2 Research Methodology**
 - 2.2.3 Result**
 - 2.2.4 Discussion**
 - 2.2.4 Conclusions and Suggestions** This section summarizes the whole thesis while indicating limitations of the research (if any) and providing suggestions for further research effort, research benefits and applications.
- 3. Bibliography or References.** This section comprises of list of references that details titles of books, publications, audiovisual materials etc.
 - 4. Appendices** are supplementary texts that cannot be included in the text section but can enhance thesis comprehension and any relevant research data that were not directly cited in the thesis.

5. Vitae is the author's biography which appears on the last page. This page should include the following information of the author:

- i. First and last name with applicable title
- ii. Student ID
- iii. Educational attainment from any degree or other academic award together with details of institution's name and year of graduation.
- iv. Scholarship awards during enrolment
- v. Work – position and address (If possible)
- vi. List of publication and proceedings (If possible)

Note: Roman Number is compulsory for No.1 (ex. i, ii, iv...) and No. 2-5 is Arabic Number.

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
